We focused on food and shelter and provided twice daily meals to anyone who was hungry as well as hygiene care packages and bagged lunches. Rossbrook House is grateful to all of our supporters who helped us to remain open to provide a safe place for children and youth. We also thank our staff for their dedication to the children

and Rossbrook House during these past few months.

Weekdays: 8am to midnight Weekends: 24 hours

After-school programming returns as well with smaller groups, physically distancing, for Learning Always, the drop-in music program, Lighthouse activities, Boys Night and Girls Night.

At this time, Eagles' Circle alternative school program is not onsite at Rossbrook House. They are at the main campus (Hugh John MacDonald School) until the COVID-19 climate is deemed acceptable to return to Rossbrook. Because of this development, Rossbrook House has **opened its doors on weekdays from 10am to 3pm to pre-school age children with a parent or guardian.** This initiative will be a great way to meet more of our neighbours!
