Working with Josep Seras Gubert, Sustainability Projects Coordinator from Green Action Centre has been enjoyable and inspiring. We can't wait to share the new space with our neighbours. Past depaying projects have included rain gardens, edible gardens, sensory gardens, naturalization, planting of trees, and green playgrounds.

This group quickly put some funds together that not only helped Rossbrook House to be completely accessible for all, but they also made it possible to renovate the washrooms in the basement, along with a grant from the Thomas Sill Foundation. Now there are two spacious and accessible, single person washrooms for participants and guests.
