"The job is so diverse that every day brings something new with so much to learn. The learning that occurred with the children and youth at Rossbrook House has afforded me the opportunity to look at programming and spaces to move the Rossbrook House community forward," she said.

Her smiling face greets participants, students, staff, and visitors. Rossbrook House is lucky to have a devoted leader who can relate to so many children and youth because she is a former participant herself.

"We all strive to make connections and relationships in our lives. It is even more important for our participants to have that champion to help quide, mentor, and just be there. Our staff are amazing at building these connections with our youth. I am so proud to be a part of this team effort. This team also includes our board of directors, funders, supporters, donors, and friends," she said.

Patty was also one of the first Junior Staff members at Rossbrook House and she graduated from Rising Sun High School. She went on to become a teacher and principal but was never far away from Rossbrook House. She was a volunteer Rossbrook House Board Director and taught Pow Wow dancing to the participants.

"Looking back to when we were kids searching for a safe space to belong, is still much needed today. More so now as our communities face many challenges with the negative impacts of intergenerational effects. Our community is not always a safe one, we strive to support our community to ensure that we have a

nurturing haven to welcome our children."

Patty and Rossbrook House staff have plans for programming, and events, including celebrating the 50th anniversary in less than three years.

"I look around the main hall with children playing and others resting, and I am flooded with ideas and excited about what the future will look like for Rossbrook House," Patty said. "I have a vested interest in making sure that we implement steps of

Reconciliation in everything we do. The reclaiming of culture, traditions, languages, and implementing experiences in land-based *learning will be beneficial for all.* We have such a rich beautiful culture and traditions that need to be celebrated and valued. My hope is to program with purpose and impact to address the needs of our participants while giving them a safe place to belong, learn, play and become"

with growing and becoming and to be able to express themselves," said Valerie, Senior Staff. "Rossbrook House allows them to be a child and to enjoy everything that comes with being a child."

While the participants are busy taking part in programs or hanging out with their friends, they're also making an impact on the community.

"Our children and youth are precious and beautiful sacred spirits that are eager to connect and take part in activities with their friends and staff", Patty Mainville said. "Their smiles are infectious and contagious; one cannot help but smile when you interact with them."

One former participant and staff member, Chantel, spent many hours at Rossbrook House with her siblings. Two of her daughters have taken part in programs including Camp Maskwa, music lessons and Pow Wow. "I talk lots to my children about Rossbrook House and what it meant to me as child", Chantel said. "It was safe, it was fun. I want them to experience the same things; making new friends, attending the adventurous outings, and having opportunities that sometimes I can't offer them."

Making memories for participants include learning to play pool or special activities like beach trips, van rides, or catching your first fish.

"I recently joined Rossbrook House and made new friends and got to hang out with new people. I really liked the activities we did and liked how I spent time outdoors a lot", said Anika, participant.

Providing programs, meals, and safe space is what Rossbrook House is all about.

"When I'm at Rossbrook House I get to be me", said Tristian, participant and Junior Staff. "Ever since I came to Rossbrook House I've become friends with almost everyone there. They make me laugh and I have a really good time while I'm with them."
