Rising Sun student and Junior staff member Jade also shared how Rossbrook House has made a difference in her life. "When I was in 9th grade, my teacher, Claire, (at Eagles' Circle) saw something in me, and she helped me to grow my leadership skills. Claire encouraged me to apply for the Junior Staff job. It's really helped me a lot." Jade also talked about her family and being the oldest of 5

children. "Being the oldest I have to be a role model, not only for my siblings, but also for the kids at Rossbrook House," she said.

There were beautiful performances by two Rising Sun students who have been taking music lessons from the drop-in program and at school. Thank you, Austin Desmarais-Thordarson and Trinity Apetagon.

## New Program with New Opportunities

There's a new Young Men's program underway at Rossbrook House called oshki-ininiwag giiwitaabiwag (translates to young men sitting in a circle in Anishinabemowin). They meet once a week with Indigenous Way of Life Coordinator, Mitch. The goal is to create a sense of community with support systems.

The group will learn about themselves, can attend sweat lodge, and take part in land-based learning such as medicine picking and fishing, as well as learn how to be healthy and supportive young men. There will also be cultural teachings from Knowledge Keepers and Elders.
